## The beneficial effects of migration on the economy

Migrants in France are a major component of the country's economy as they consist of more than 10% of the total workload and thus, account for 6% of GDP.

Migration provides skilled and unskilled labour force, both are useful because there is a shortage of both qualified and non-qualified workers. Non-qualified labour is crucial for the present and future economy of the country as the population ages and the European low birth rate leads to a lack of workforce in the long term.

# THE CHARACTERTICS

- Migration has an historical importance for France. In the early 2000s, 25% of the population have migrant background, from the first, second or third generation.
- As of 2019, the country was the third most popular European destination for refugees after Germany and the United Kingdom.
- 29.4 million people aged 15 to 64 living in Metropolitan France were active in 2018. Within this active population, there were 3.1 million migrants.
  Migrant workers represent 10.5% of the total working population in France, of which almost 70% come from countries outside the EU. 69.2% of the migrants aged from 15 to 64 years old are active.

#### Migrant's cultural integration and contribution to French society

Migrants in France play a significant role in influencing French daily life in many ways:

- Primarily seen in terms of the varieties of restaurants, the mix of French and other countries food traditions.
- Increasingly some of the radio stations and TV programs in France have become a reference point for news and cultural events involving the French Arab community, but it is also of interest to French people of all origins.
- The contributions migrants make to the **artistic and athletic life** are numerous: French soccer champion Zinedine Zidane remains one of the country's most admired figures; one of the leading members of the Paris opera-ballet is of North African origin; the movie star Jamel Debbouze has Moroccan origin as well.
- Linguistically, migrants originated for a new French slang language known as "verlan" that was founded in France's migrant-heavy housing projects.
  "Verlan" is a kind of argotic vocabulary of the suburbs, the inner cities, where they change the order of the syllables.
- Malek Boutih, from SOS Racism, believes the influence of ethnic Arabs has revitalised French arts and sports and will emerge as a dominating influence in French culture this century.
